- Provides business coaching to improve your confidence in making business decisions and managing farm risk.
- Gives you the knowledge and tools needed to get the most out of your farming business.
- Helps you develop strategies and actions on how to manage risks and progress opportunities.
- Offers new skills and techniques to build your own personal resilience, to help you focus on the opportunities and be equipped to deal with challenges.

Develop or update a farm business plan tailored to suit your own agribusiness, risks and situation.

Your plan will cover the relevant issues for you in the areas of:

- finance and business;
- people and culture;
- natural resource and asset management;
- climate sustainable practices; and
- sustainable irrigation and farm safety.
