



REPORT ANYTHING UNUSUAL

See it. Secure it. Report it.

Keep an eye out for anything that may be unusual or out of place - it could be a serious biosecurity risk to Tasmania.

If you SEE something that looks out of place, such as sick wildlife or insect larvae in your fresh food, note the location, take a photo, and SECURE or isolate the suspected concern if practicable.

REPORT the issue as soon as possible to Biosecurity Tasmania, as well as to your local vet in cases of suspected animal diseases.

By learning the Biosecurity Basics, you are playing your role in protecting Tasmania's primary industries, economy, environment and way of life from the devastating impacts of pests, weeds and diseases.

CHECK YOUR BAGS

Be careful about what you bring into Tasmania.

Tasmania has some of the world's strictest biosecurity rules. Please help us protect our primary industries, economy, environment, and way of life from introduced pests, weeds and diseases by ensuring that you do not carry or import any restricted or prohibited materials into Tasmania.

So, whether you are travelling or returning to Tasmania, be sure to CHECK YOUR BAGS!

COME IN CLEAN

Be sure to arrive in Tasmania with clean clothing, gear and equipment.

You could pose a disastrous risk to Tasmania's biosecurity with infectious materials, seeds or pests that may be lurking on your clothes or shoes. These dangers can also hide in the contaminants found on your motor vehicle, farming tools or recreational equipment.

Be sure to thoroughly CLEAN all your clothing and equipment BEFORE ARRIVING in Tasmania.



STAY ON THE PATH

Do not enter private lands or properties without permission.

Please resist the temptation of jumping fences to capture the perfect selfie - you could unintentionally introduce or spread an unwanted pest, weed or disease in the area.

If you are trekking through Tasmania's many scenic parks and reserves, it is vital that you stay on the existing paths and tracks.

Please respect the biosecurity plans and protocols of the area's respective owners, operators, and managers, and ALWAYS SEEK PERMISSION before entering properties and facilities.
