

## Circular Memorandum No. 2 / 2010

TOPIC: **LISTmap Survey Search Information**

DATE: **1<sup>st</sup> July 2010**

Additional survey search information is now available on LISTmap. Crown ASSIST spatial layers are available to any LIST subscriber who currently has access to the Survey Investigations layer on LISTmap. This information, although not complete at the present time, is being made available to help surveyors with the identification of search relevant to their survey activities.

Crown ASSIST refers to a set of spatial layers created to provide specific information related to Crown Grants, Lands Office surveys and their indexing. Of most interest to surveyors are the following layers:

Information	Layer Name
• Crown Grants	• ASSIST Grants
• Land Districts	• ASSIST Land Districts
• Parishes and Towns	• ASSIST Parishes and Towns
• Lands Office Survey Plan References	• ASSIST Survey Plan References


These layers can be accessed using the 'Manage Layers' function in LISTmap. Select 'Crown ASSIST' from the 'Land Use and Administration' category then select the layers to apply. The information for items from each layer can be accessed by selecting the layer on the side bar and using the identify tool.

While the layers showing Land Districts and Parishes are largely complete, users should be aware of the following limitations with the remaining information:

- there is very limited Survey Plan Reference or Grant information available within towns
- the Survey Plan Reference layer is largely complete only for surveys prior to 1999
- where towns have been created or extended to overlap previous parishes, the Parishes and Towns layer may not reflect that change.

Although this digital information was quality assured at the time of entry, it is incomplete and there may be errors. There will be no additions, amendments or corrections made to these layers in the short term because it is intended that a new, authoritative 'Survey Point Layer' will be developed to replace Crown ASSIST.
