NOTICE TO TRAINERS OF ALL CODES CARBINE CHEMICALS - APVMA NOTICE TO STOP SUPPLY

The Office of Racing Integrity advises all industry participants that the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) issued a notice to Carbine Chemicals Pty Ltd on 30 July 2020 in relation to the following unregistered chemical products:

Adrenamax	Amalgamax	Boostamax	Carbalene
Carbelyte	Carbine-E	Carb-Iron	Citramax
Cyanamax	Folamax	Gastrazone	Haematonic
Instant B	Iron Donor	Ironamax	Jetramax

The notice required the Company to immediately stop supply of the listed Products; to immediately notify any person who has possession or custody of the listed Products either directly or indirectly because of a supply by the Company that they must stop supply of the Products and return it to the Company immediately; and take all necessary steps to recover all stocks of the listed Products from any person that the Company has either directly or indirectly supplied the Products to.

Consequently, Trainers are advised to immediately stop the use of any of the abovementioned products and return them to Carbine Chemicals Pty Ltd.

Trainers are reminded of the relevant Rules of Racing in relation to Unregistered Substances:

Thoroughbred: *AR 252 Possession of medication/substance/preparation in breach of legislation*

(1) A person must not have in his or her possession or on his or her premises any medication, substance or preparation which has not been registered, labelled, prescribed, dispensed or obtained in accordance with applicable Commonwealth and State legislation.

(2) The Stewards may confiscate any medication, substance or preparation referred to in subrule (1), and use it as evidence in any inquiry, hearing or other proceeding under the Rules

Harness: Australian Harness Racing Rules.

Unregistered Substances

194. A person who:

- (a) Procures or attempts to procure;
- (b) Has in his possession or on his premises or under his control;
- (c) Administers or attempts to administer;

any substance or preparation that has not been registered, labelled, prescribed or obtained in compliance with relevant State and Commonwealth legislation is guilty of an offence.

194A. A person who:

- (a) Sells or attempts to sell;
- (b) Supplies or attempts to supply;
- (c) Distributes or attempts to distribute;

any substance or preparation that has not been registered, labelled, prescribed or obtained in compliance with relevant State and Commonwealth legislation is guilty of an offence

Greyhounds: *GARR84 Possession of prohibited substance*

(1) For the purpose of this Rule “possession” means any form of personal physical possession, or the on-site control/storage, of a prohibited substance.

(2) A registered person who has in their possession at any place used in relation to the training or racing of a greyhound, any quantity of a prohibited substance commits an offence unless that substance has been registered or labelled, or prescribed, dispensed or obtained, in compliance with the relevant State or Commonwealth legislation. The Stewards may take possession of any of these substances or preparations to test and or destroy. (amended – 01.01.14)

For the purposes of this Rule, if a prohibited substance is found at any place used in relation to the training or racing of a greyhound then any owner, trainer or attendant who owns, trains, races or is in charge of greyhounds at that place is deemed to have the prohibited substance in their possession.
