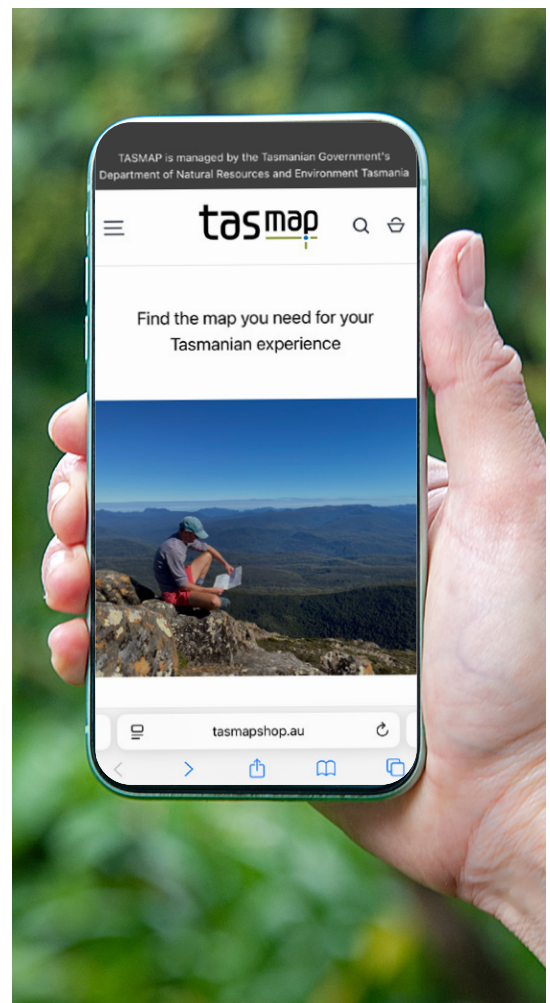
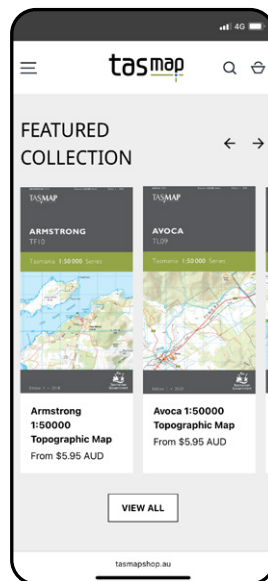
TASMAP's new online shop

As part of the Land Titles Office's ambitious business transformation program, it is introducing safer and more secure conveyancing processes removing the need for paper certificates of title.

As a result the Recorder of Titles has announced that subject to any unforeseen circumstances, paper certificates of title will be removed on 1 September 2026.

The new LISTmap and COP come to life

Development of the new LISTmap and Common Operating Platform (COP) is rapidly progressing towards a November 2026 completion.

In September 2025 Land Tasmania and its development partner Geometry Pty Ltd delivered the first version of the new platform for internal review and ongoing refinement. This version confirmed the key IT infrastructure and design features of the new platform. It forms the basis for ongoing development where the extensive list of new and exciting features will be added.

Searching, layer management, bookmarks, markup tools and printing are all being enhanced. Some of the exciting new features include mobile phone functionality, the ability to create your own dashboard to save your LISTmap/COP activities, and viewing and navigating in 3D (see image below).

The next major internal release of the platform will be July 2026, and will include most of the functionality. Awareness, testing and training activities with key users will continue until November.

LISTmap and COP currently provides access to over 3200 spatial datasets over Tasmania. The spatial datasets include natural resources, roads, agricultural enterprise suitability, community facilities, property boundaries, aerial imagery and survey information.

There are over 1950 datasets specifically used in the management of emergencies and incidents ranging from power, water, sewerage utilities data, sensitive flora, fauna and heritage sites, to flood and fire history.
