

# Volunteering with NRE Tas



## Citizen science

Involves members of the public assisting us to collect information relating to our natural world and providing personal conservation efforts, such as the Gardens and Land for Wildlife programs



## Visitor information

Dedicated volunteers provide assistance to the public with information on services and points of interest within Tasmania's National Parks and Reserves, Wetlands and Botanical Gardens



## Education activities

NRE Tas partners with skilled educators to provide experiences for Tasmania's next generation, new citizens and the general public, to experience, understand and protect Tasmania's beautiful environment.



## Emergency assistance

Volunteers work with NRE Tas as part of emergency response efforts following unforeseen events such as floods, bushfires and whale strandings.



## Threatened species

Volunteers work alongside NRE Tas Biologists and Field Officers to monitor unique and diverse flora and fauna and assist with marine conservation programs. Other activities include assistance with threatened species breeding populations such as the Save the Tasmanian Devil and Orange-bellied Parrot programs.



## Community partners

NRE Tas partners with a range of volunteer groups such as Wildcare, Landcare, sporting clubs and community associations to achieve diverse and unique conservation and restoration outcomes and to encourage community responsibility for special places.



## Fisheries

Trained and enthusiastic Fishcare volunteers actively engage with the community to assist with sustainable recreational fishing practices. Volunteers provide education and guidance at schools, community events, popular fishing spots and host fishing clinics.



## Caretakers

Volunteer caretakers love wild places. NRE Tas Parks and Wildlife Caretakers assist in providing information and protection within remote locations, campsites and visitor centres.



## Parks and Reserves

Dedicated volunteers partner with the Parks and Wildlife Service to care for the natural environment across a range of programs, including pest and weed eradication, historical site and walking tracks restoration, snow sports assistance and flora and fauna conservation.



## Horticulture

Green thumbed volunteers assist NRE Tas to establish and care for beautiful spaces that support visitor enjoyment and critical habitats, such as the Royal Tasmanian Botanical Gardens and our threatened species enclosures.
